Monday evening June 1 the Hull Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to employ Carl Sinderbrand of the Axley Brynson Law Firm of Madison.

Attorney Sinderbrand will continue the investigation of Well #11 impact on Hull water supply and explore potential legal action against the City of Stevens Point. Attorney Sinderbrand is a well recognized attorney in water law and has extensive experience in litigation on water issues.

Attorney Sinderbrand replaces the Anderson, O'Brien Law Firm of Stevens Point. On April 27, 2015 the Anderson, O'Brien Law Firm withdrew from representing Hull in the Well 11 legal investigation citing conflict of interest issues. The Anderson, O'Brien Law Firm withdrawal was unexpected. The firm has worked on Well #11 legal issues since October 2013 but has advised and represented Hull in legal matters since 1991.

Attorney Sinderbrand will continue the overall investigation of Well #11's impact on Hull households. He will explore Well #11 impacts as it expands its capacity to 5 million gallons per day and with modification to its treatment plant to 13 million gallons per day. Attorney Gary Dreier of Stevens Point is representing the 33+/- households who have already lost water and incurred substantial financial cost to replace wells and/or pumps.

The Hull Board of Supervisors remain confident that Well #11 caused the draw down effecting 33(+) households and presents a serious threat to Hull future water supply should Well #11 pump 5 million gallons per day or to 13 million gallons per day with modification of its treatment plant.
